Driving Directions

Adrian College is 90 minutes southwest of Detroit, 40 minutes northwest of Toledo and 40 minutes south of Ann Arbor.

From the **North/Northwest** (Jackson, Lansing, Kalamazoo, Grand Rapids) Take US 223 to the outskirts of Adrian. From the left lane, turn onto Business 223 (Maumee Street). Turn right on either Charles or Madison Street.

From the **North/Northeast** (Ann Arbor, Detroit, Flint) Take M-52 south into town, wind around the courthouse, turn right on Maumee Street. After about a mile, turn left on Madison Avenue, which will take you directly to the College.

From the **West** (Hudson, Hillsdale, Coldwater) Take M-34 (Beecher Road) east to Adrian. Just after the US-223 overpass, turn left at Madison Street (stop light).

From the **South**, M-52 becomes Main Street. Take Main Street north past the malls. Turn left on Beecher (Walgreen’s and Wendy’s at the intersection). The second stop light is Madison Street. Turn right.

From the **Southeast** (Toledo), take US-223 to Main Street (Adrian Mall on your right). Turn right on Main Street. Take Main Street north past the malls. Turn left on Beecher (Walgreen’s and Wendy’s at the intersection). The second stop light is Madison Street. Turn right
